### WARNING

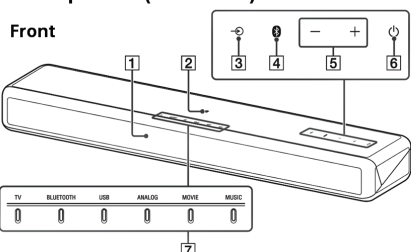

#### Bar Speaker (Main Unit)



- 1 Remote control sensor**  
Point the remote control at the remote control sensor to operate the system.
- 2 N-Mark**  
When using the NFC function, touch your NFC-compatible device to the mark.
- 3 (input select) button**
- 4 BLUETOOTH PAIRING button (page 20)**
- 5 +/- (volume) buttons**
- 6 (power) button**  
Turns on the system or sets it to standby mode.
- 7 Indicators**  
For details, see "About the indicators on the main unit"

### About the indicators on the main unit

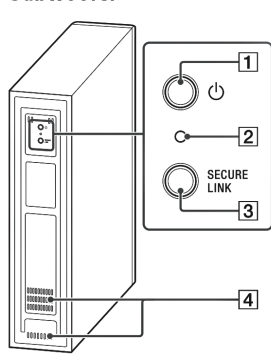
Lighting and flashing of the indicator(s) on the main unit indicate the input or status of the input device.

ANALOG	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lights: Analog input is selected.</li> <li>• Flashes once: While changing the volume/subwoofer volume.</li> </ul>

### Subwoofer

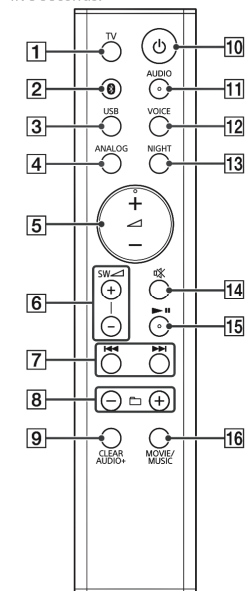


- 1 (power) button**  
Turns on the subwoofer or sets it to standby mode.
- 2 Power indicator**
  - Lights in red: The subwoofer is in standby mode
  - Lights in green: The subwoofer is connected to the system
  - Lights in orange: The subwoofer is connected to the system with the Secure Link function
  - Flashes in green: The subwoofer is attempting to connect to the system
  - Flashes in orange: The subwoofer is attempting to connect to the system with the Secure Link function
  - Flashes in red: The protection feature of the subwoofer is activated.
- 3 SECURE LINK button**
- 4 Ventilation holes**  
For safety, do not block the ventilation holes.

### Remote Control

Some buttons function differently depending on how long the button is pressed. The icons below indicate how long to press the button.

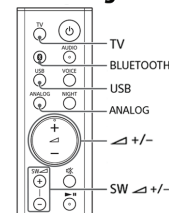
- : Press the button.
- : Press and hold the button for five seconds.



- 1 TV**  
Selects the TV connected to the TV IN (OPTICAL) jack for output sound.
- 2 BLUETOOTH**  
Activates the BLUETOOTH function on the system.
- 3 USB**  
Selects the USB connected to the (USB) port for output sound.
- 4 ANALOG**
  - : Selects the TV connected to the ANALOG IN jack for output sound.
  - : Turns on/off the audio attenuation function.
- 5 +/- (volume) +/-**  
Adjusts the volume.
- 6 SW +/- (subwoofer volume) +/- (page 19)**  
Adjusts the volume of the subwoofer.
- 7 (previous/next)**  
Go to the beginning of the previous or next file.
- 8 (select)**  
Switches between previous and next folder to be played for USB playback.
- 9 CLEAR AUDIO+**
  - : Selects CLEAR AUDIO+ for the sound effect.
  - : Activates the secure link mode.
- 10 (power)**  
Turns on the system or sets it to standby mode.
- 11 AUDIO\***
  - : Selects the audio channel for Dolby Digital multiplex broadcast.
  - : Turns on/off the Dolby DRC function.
- 12 VOICE**
  - : Turns on/off the voice mode.
  - : Turns on/off the sofa mode.
- 13 NIGHT**
  - : Turns on/off the night mode.
  - : Turns on/off the BLUE TOOTH standby mode.
- 14 (muting)**  
Turns off the sound temporarily.
- 15 (play/pause)\***  
Pauses or resumes playback.
- 16 MOVIE/MUSIC**
  - : Selects MOVIE or MUSIC for the sound effect.
  - : Turns on/off the auto standby function.

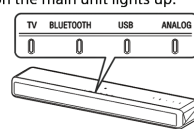
\* The AUDIO, (play/pause), and +/- buttons have a tactile dot. Use it as a guide during operation.

### Listening to the Sound Listening to a TV and Other Devices



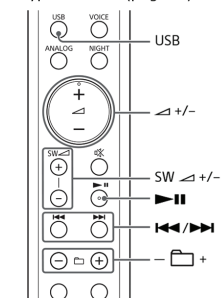
- 1 Press TV, ANALOG, BLUETOOTH, or USB to select the input that the desired device is connected.**

The indicator of the selected input on the main unit lights up.

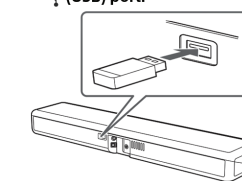


### Listening to Music on a USB Device

You can play music files stored on a connected USB device. For playable types of files, see "Playable Types of Files" (page 33).



- 1 Connect the USB device to the (USB) port.**



- 2 Press USB.**
- 3 Press (play/pause).**

- 4 Press (previous) + (next) to switch between previous and next folder to be played.**

You can go to the beginning of the previous or next file by using (previous) + (next) on the remote control.

**TV**  
TV that is connected to the TV IN (OPTICAL) jack

**ANALOG**  
TV that is connected to the ANALOG IN jack

**BLUETOOTH**  
BLUETOOTH device that supports A2DP. For details, see "Listening to Music/Sound with the BLUETOOTH Function"

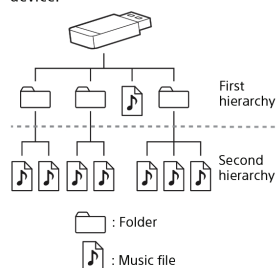
**USB**  
USB device that is connected to the (USB) port. For details, see "Listening to Music on a USB Device".

**Tip**  
If you press (input select) on the main unit, the device changes cyclically as follows. TV → BLUETOOTH → USB → ANALOG

### Playback Order of Music

If there is a folder on the USB device, music files are played in order from the music files on the first hierarchy.

The playback order of music files differs depending on the file system of the USB device.



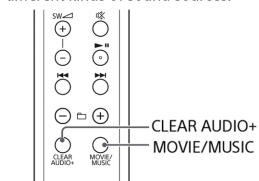
File system	Playback order of the folder and music file
FAT32	Recorded date and time order (old to new)
NTFS	Folder or file name order

### Selecting the Sound Effect

### Setting the Sound Effect that is Tailored to Sound Sources

You can easily enjoy pre-programmed sound effects that are tailored to different kinds of sound sources.



Press CLEAR AUDIO+ or MOVIE/MUSIC to select the sound effects. When selecting MOVIE or MUSIC, press MOVIE/MUSIC repeatedly.

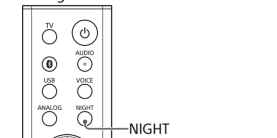
**CLEAR AUDIO+**  
You can enjoy the sound with Sony-recommended sound field. Sound field is automatically optimized according to playback content and function. The MOVIE and MUSIC indicators light up for 2 seconds and turn off.

**MOVIE**  
Sounds are played back with surround effects, and they are realistic and powerful, making them suitable for movies. The MOVIE indicator lights up.

**MUSIC**  
Sound effects are optimized for listening to music. The MUSIC indicator lights up.

### Enjoying Clear Sound with Low Volume at Midnight (NIGHT)

You can compresses sound in accordance with the information contained in the content by setting the night mode to on. Sound is output at low volume with minimum loss of fidelity and clarity of dialogue.



Press NIGHT to set the function to on or off.

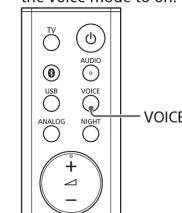
**Night mode on**  
The MOVIE and MUSIC indicators flash twice.

**Night mode off**  
The MOVIE indicator flashes twice.

**Note**  
When you turn the system off, the night mode is set to off automatically.

### Making Dialogues Clearer (VOICE)

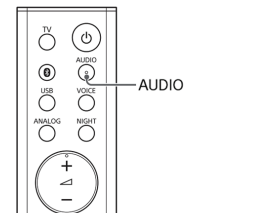
You can make dialogs clearer by setting the voice mode to on.



Press VOICE to set the function to on or off.

**Voice mode on**  
The MOVIE and MUSIC indicators flash twice.

**Voice mode off**  
The MOVIE indicator flashes twice.



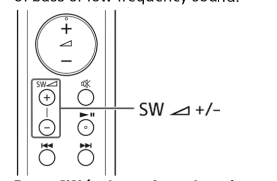
Hold down AUDIO for 5 seconds to set the function to on or off.

**Dolby DRC on**  
The USB and ANALOG indicators flash twice.

**Dolby DRC off**  
The USB indicator flashes twice.

### Adjusting the Volume of the Subwoofer

The subwoofer is designed for playback of bass or low frequency sound.



Press SW (subwoofer volume) +/- to adjust the volume of the subwoofer.

**Note**  
When the input source does not contain much bass sound, such as in TV programs, the bass sound from the subwoofer may be difficult to hear.

### Making Sound with Low Volume Easy to Hear by Compressing Dynamic Range

This function works only when playing the Dolby Digital signal of the device that is connected to the TV IN (OPTICAL) jack. When you set Dolby DRC (Dynamic Range Control) to on, dynamic range of the audio signal (range between the maximum and minimum volume) is compressed and sound with low volume is easy to hear.

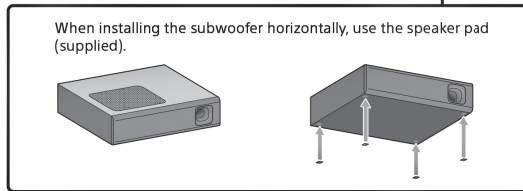
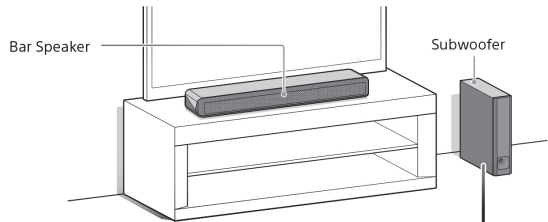




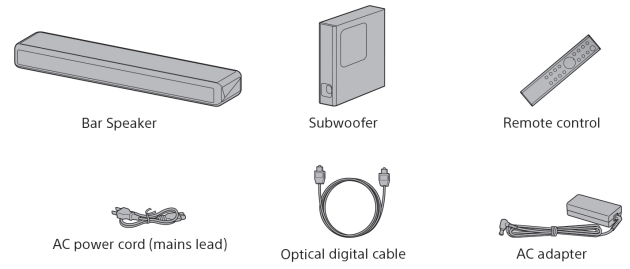

# 1 Connecting with a TV

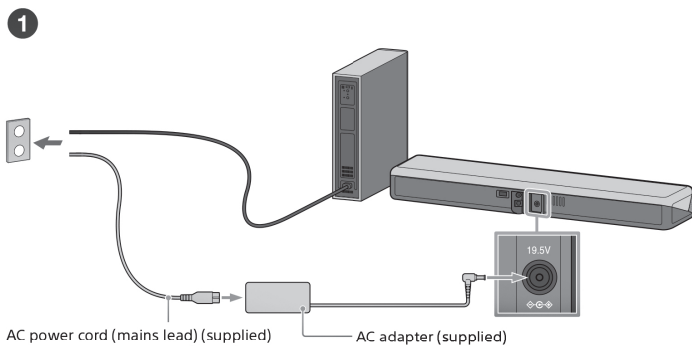
Is there an optical digital jack on your TV?



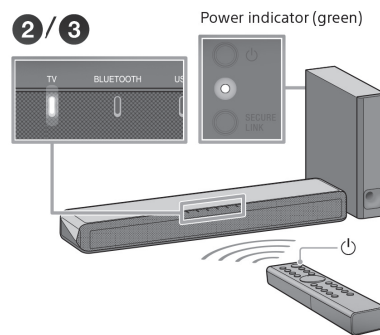
**Note**


- If the TV's headphone jack also serves as an audio output jack, check the TV's audio output settings. For details, refer to the TV's operating instructions.
- Make sure that the cables are firmly inserted.

## 2 Turning on the system



AC power cord (mains lead) (supplied) AC adapter (supplied)

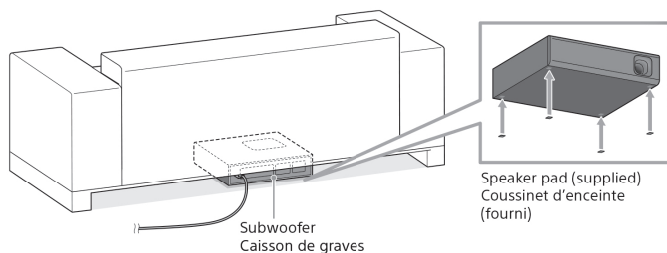


- 1 Connect the AC adapter and AC power cord (mains lead), then connect the AC adapter to the Bar Speaker. Connect the AC power cords (mains leads) of the Bar Speaker and subwoofer to the AC outlets (mains).
- 2 Press  (power) on the remote control of the system. An input indicator lights up.
- 3 Confirm that the power indicator of the subwoofer is lit in green. If not, refer to "Subwoofer" or "Troubleshooting" in the Operating Instructions (separate document).

### Note

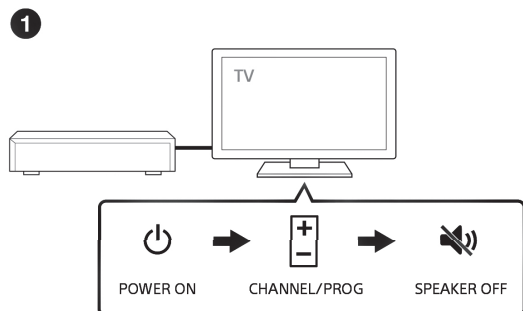
- Do not place magnetic cards on the system or near the system.
- Do not place metal objects other than a TV around the system. Wireless functions may become unstable.

### To install the subwoofer under a sofa

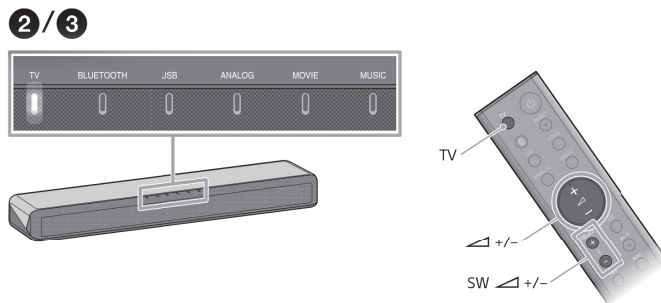




- 1 Put the speaker pads on the subwoofer, then place the subwoofer under a sofa with the speaker facing upward.
- 2 Hold down VOICE on the remote control of the system for 5 seconds. The USB and ANALOG indicators flash twice, then the sofa mode is activated. The sound quality is changed to suit when the subwoofer is installed under a sofa.

## 3 Listening to the sound



- 1 Turn on the TV, then select the desired program by operating the TV. When sound comes from the TV speakers, try one of the following to silence the TV speakers. For details, refer to the TV's operating instructions.
  - Change the TV setting to output the sound from external speakers.
  - Turn the TV volume down as minimal as possible.



- 2 Press TV on the remote control of the system to turn on the TV indicator. If you connected your TV to the ANALOG jack in step 1, press ANALOG on the remote control of the system.
- 3 Adjust the volume. Adjust the volume by pressing  +/- on the remote control of the system. Adjust the volume of the subwoofer by pressing SW  +/- on the remote control of the system.
